Walking with Jesus. On Sunday, June 19th, we will celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord. All around the United States, on that day, each Diocese has been asked to sponsor a Diocesan Eucharistic Procession. Bishop McClory invites you to come and publicly walk with Jesus, in a Eucharistic procession from Our Lady of Grace Church in Highland to St. James the Less Church in Highland (1.6 miles). We begin at Our Lady of Grace at 2:00pm with prayer and adoration and step off in our procession at 2:40 PM. Bishop McClory will be the celebrant. At the conclusion of the procession, a picnic lunch will be served at St. James in honor of all our fathers.

It is also Father's Day. The two might seem at odds with one another. Yet, our Heavenly Father is praised when we honor His Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ. Earthly fathers are best when they reflect the love of the Heavenly Father. The love they reflect is that of Jesus himself, one with the Father and the Spirit.
