

Sunday Readings Reflections of 1/24/2016

Reading 1 Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Today's reading presents an interesting picture of the priest Ezra standing above the people to deliver his interpretation of the law of God. His reading goes on for hours and saddens the people as they consider how much they need to reform their lives. Perhaps their weeping finally convinces Ezra to "take it easy on them." He and Nehemiah, the governor of Judah, then encourage the people to celebrate their observance of the law. The people, they say, should have a great feast because "rejoicing in the Lord" will be their source of strength.

Reading 2 <u>1 Corinthians 12:12-30 or 12:12-14,</u> <u>27</u>

Human beings have a desire to belong—to another person, to a community, or to God. We can imagine how the Christians at Corinth welcomed Paul's letter assuring them that they were all "one body." They were not to create divisions among themselves by identifying as Jews or Greeks, slaves or free people, women or men. Because they had all been anointed by the Holy Spirit, they had become together the one body of Christ. Each was a member; no one was left out.

Gospel Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

Just as Ezra, in our first reading, read to the people from Scripture, Jesus reads from the book of the prophet Isaiah about the Servant of the Lord. He announces that he is the fulfillment of Scripture. Then he tells the crowd in the synagogue that he is the one sent by God. His presence is their guarantee that a "year of favor," or time of salvation, has begun. All eyes are glued on him as he puts down the scroll and takes his seat.

Pastor's Column

Dear Parishioners:

Jesus is the Word made flesh that enters into every part of our humanity, filling us with his divine presence. Our Lord's saving Word is how the divine permeates our humanity from head-to-toe. If we speak about God, then we must put into action God's Word that comes out of our speaking. God does not parcel out His presence only in our mouths, but rather, God's presence is allencompassing through our Holy Communion with the Son of God made human. Thus, we cannot simply speak the Gospel message, but we must also put the Gospel into action. God's Word and putting the Word into action is living Holy Communion with Jesus.

Because God is eternally faithful to us in Christ the Son, there is no part of our humanity that is lacking in God's loving presence. From head-totoe we are filled with God's faithful presence all the time. Weekly Eucharist strengthens our awareness that God's Love is not only Word, but in Christ born into our humanity, God's word is put into loving, healing, and reconciling action. God's saving word is always one in us with accompanying action, thanks to the dynamic Holy Spirit within us.

Jesus reminds us in the Gospel that we cannot relate to God only with our lips voicing words. Christmas celebrates how God makes His Word flesh in Jesus born of Mary, that is, God not only speaks words of Love for the world but God also puts His Word into loving action thanks to Jesus' public ministry. Jesus' actions include many healings and reconciling moments which are indicative of how God loves us thru-and-thru every part of our humanity. God's Oneness with us is constant in Christ, so let us live God's Word from head-totoe in our daily lives through our word and action Holy Communion with Christ and our neighbors.


