

Sunday Readings Reflections of 2/21/2016**Reading 1 Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18**

Many of us have had the difficult experience of having to pack up and move on, leaving our homes and friends behind. We can imagine how Abram, later known as Abraham, might have felt when God called him to journey to a new and unfamiliar land. Despite his doubts and questions, Abram "put his faith in the Lord." He gave up everything, including his pagan gods, and accepted God's promise of countless descendants.

The covenant between God and Abraham was sealed in a special ceremony of sacrifice. The smoke and flame in that ceremony represent the presence of God moving between the broken animal halves. This is a sign that neither Abram, who stays with the sacrificial animals, nor God, whose presence is signaled, will break the covenant.

Reading 2 Philippians 3:17--4:1 or 3:20--4:1

Today's second reading reminds us that as Christians sharing in God's life we are already citizens of heaven. Neither our earthly homes nor our physical bodies are lasting. But one day our bodies will be transformed and become like the glorified body of the risen Jesus. This is the great and final hope of every Christian.

Gospel Luke 9:28b-36

Wouldn't it be wonderful to see your best friend transformed, or turned into his or her glorified self, right before your eyes? That's the kind of experience Peter, James, and John have in today's gospel. While they are up on a mountain with Jesus, they have a splendid vision of him in his glorified body. They see him talking with Moses and Elijah, two long-dead figures from the Old Testament. Moses represents the Law, while Elijah represents the prophets. In Jesus, both find the fulfillment of God's plan of salvation.

Pastor's Column

Dear Parishioners:

There is a temptation that wells up in us sometimes to down-play God's importance in our lives. To go-it-alone, that is, without God is a temptation for us especially if we are not impressed with how our lives are going. Sometimes we shake our heads in frustration because life is so unpredictable. And we end up asking "Why?" And then maybe we ask SIRI on the smartphone for an answer to our "Why?" No answer she gives will satisfy our "Why?" because the "Why?" is a mystery.

Our faith in Christ encourages us to quiet down about trying to explain the "Why?" and patiently BE silent in God's faithful wisdom within us. An explanation will surface that proclaims to us that all is well in Christ! We may retort that this is impossible. How can all be well when we are frustrated about life? God's response to us is that frustration is our idea, but that in Christ the ever faithful savior, we can let go of the frustration and more peaceably face every moment of life. This is Holy Communion: trusting Jesus is saving love in every moment. And to live with this oneness in Christ is faith.

When the temptation arises in us to down-play God's importance in our lives, especially at times of frustration, it is our faith in Christ the Savior of the world who brings us peace. SIRI on the smartphone is not the answer to the mystery of daily life. Any head-shaking is to only be nods up-and-down that acknowledges our faithful "yes" to Jesus in our every moment.

**2016-2017 Tuition Assistance
Program Now ONLINE!**

The tuition assistance application for the 2016-2017 school year is now available on the Diocese of Gary website at <http://www.dcgary.org/catholic-schools.htm>. Click the Tuition Assistance Application tab and you will be directed to the application. Parish DO NOT have paper copies this year. If you require a paper copy, you must contact the diocese of Gary Office of Catholic Schools and request a copy be mailed to you.

Catholic families who belong to a Diocese of Gary parish and have their children enrolled in any diocesan school, Kindergarten—Gr. 12, may apply. Preschool students are not eligible. A \$30.00 non-refundable processing fee must accompany the application and will be paid via credit card, debit card, or checking account online. Approximately \$500,000 is distributed on the basis of need to assist Catholic parents in providing Catholic faith formation, strong academic programs, and safety for their children in our Catholic schools.

The filing deadline is Monday, February 22, 2016. This is the date that completed applications must be submitted online. PSAS will not accept any applications mailed directly to the company. This deadline will be strictly enforced. Parents will be notified of the results in writing by May, 2016.
