



Sunday Readings Reflections of 2/28/2016

Reading 1 Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15

What a dramatic scene the Book of Exodus depicts for us today! Moses, who had escaped from Egypt, is now a shepherd. He has been leading a simple life tending sheep. But all that changes in an instant when he encounters a burning bush at Mount Horeb. As he takes a closer look, he hears God calling him by name and instructing him to take off his sandals as a mark of respect for this holy place. God assures Moses that the cries of the people in captivity have been heard. God will not only rescue the people but will lead them to the Promised Land.

When Moses realizes that God wants him to return to Egypt and lead the Israelites, Moses says that the people will not believe him because he does not know God's name. Moses learns God's name. It is Yahweh, meaning "I am who am."

Reading 2 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12

Paul's letter to the Christian community at Corinth is filled with advice about keeping the faith. In today's reading he reminds the people that they cannot take their new faith for granted. Faith means that we are called to conversion, to turn to God each day.

Lent is a season of penance, a time for conversion. Our challenge is to give evidence that we are truly followers of Christ. Pray together: Lord, teach us the meaning of conversion. Help us to live lives of service and love.

Gospel Luke 13:1-9

Sometimes when we see a terrible accident or hear about people who are being persecuted, we may think that such things will never happen to us. Some people in Jesus' time believed that those who suffered such tragedies and injustices were being punished because they were great sinners. Jesus sets them straight in today's gospel reading. He says that suffering comes from injustice in our world.

Pastor's Column

Dear Parishioners:

Have you ever observed a lighthouse? There is one in Michigan City on the shores of Lake Michigan. It flashes its light to alert ships of the shoreline and where to find their port of entry. Without a lighthouse the waters are dangerous to try to navigate such that we get lost or crash into the breakwater. Lighthouses are essential to wise navigation and they are strategically placed around Lake Michigan to provide this important guide.

Jesus is our constant lighthouse who communes in our depths, flashing away in the Holy Spirit guiding us to stay on the course of faithful love. There may be times when we get lost in the fog of sin but the light of Jesus flashes "come back to me with all your heart". (Hosea) Jesus is always one with us so we don't have to panic about sin, but we do need to acknowledge that we do not want to stay lost or crash in our sin.

Jesus is always guiding us away from sin crashes so that we more consistently have inner peace. Lent points us to be more aware of Jesus as our lighthouse of saving love. Lighthouses on Lake Michigan serve a valuable purpose but Jesus serves an eternally valuable purpose for her loves us to death and into new life. We can humbly face our sin, trusting that Jesus is mercy, our port of forgiveness. The flashing light of salvation guides us to more faithfully follow God's Will as revealed by Jesus. This resulting Wisdom is our life-giving navigation for our daily faith journey with our beloved Jesus communing with us in our depths to deepen our inner peace given to us in the constant flash of saving love.

2016-2017 Tuition Assistance Program Now ONLINE!

The tuition assistance application for the 2016-2017 school year is now available on the Diocese of Gary website at <http://www.dcgary.org/catholic-schools.htm>. Click the Tuition Assistance Application tab and you will be directed to the application. Parish DO NOT have paper copies this year. If you require a paper copy, you must contact the diocese of Gary Office of Catholic Schools and request a copy be mailed to you.

Catholic families who belong to a Diocese of Gary parish and have their children enrolled in any diocesan school, Kindergarten—Gr. 12, may apply. Preschool students are not eligible. A \$30.00 non-refundable processing fee must accompany the application and will be paid via credit card, debit card, or checking account online. Approximately \$500,000 is distributed on the basis of need to assist Catholic parents in providing Catholic faith formation, strong academic programs, and safety for their children in our Catholic schools.

The filing deadline is Monday, February 22, 2016. This is the date that completed applications must be submitted online. PSAS will not accept any applications mailed directly to the company. This deadline will be strictly enforced. Parents will be notified of the results in writing by May, 2016.


