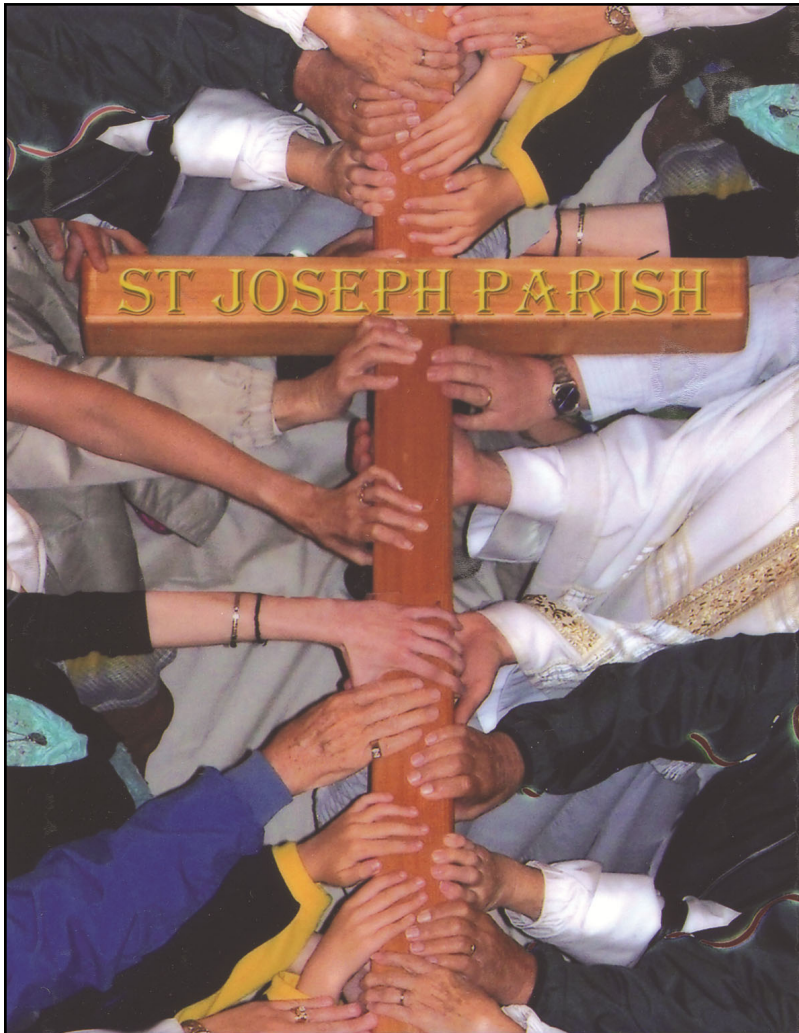

Pastor’s Column

Sometimes we speak about being “fired up”, ready to go. We have abundant energy for getting to work or school or this time of year to go on a vacation. We bubble over with energy for life and we are not sure where it originates. Could it be that meal we had for breakfast, lunch or dinner? It must be the caffeine in the tea or coffee? Wait a second here, we need to remember that we are Pentecost people, that is, Holy Spirit lead people! Habitat for Humanity

On Thursday, June 13, the Diocese of Gary, in partnership with Habitat for Humanity of NW Indiana, will begin building a Habitat house. It will be built on property donated by the Diocese, and located directly across from the Cathedral rectory on Tyler Street. It will be a four week build ending on Saturday, July 13. The volunteers will work on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of each week, from 7:30am to 4:00pm. You can volunteer for a full day, a full week, or half of day. Flyers and registration forms are located in the vestibules. Follow the instructions on the form.

The build will be coordinated by members of the Diocesan Peace/Social Justice Commission, and students from the Lay Ministry Program. The goal is to have a team of workers from every parish participate in the build. Teams large and small will work as carpenters, painters and helpers. We need volunteers for these tasks as well as, people willing to prepare and serve lunch each day at noon and a snack in the afternoon. Volunteers must be 18 yrs. And older to work on the site.
