

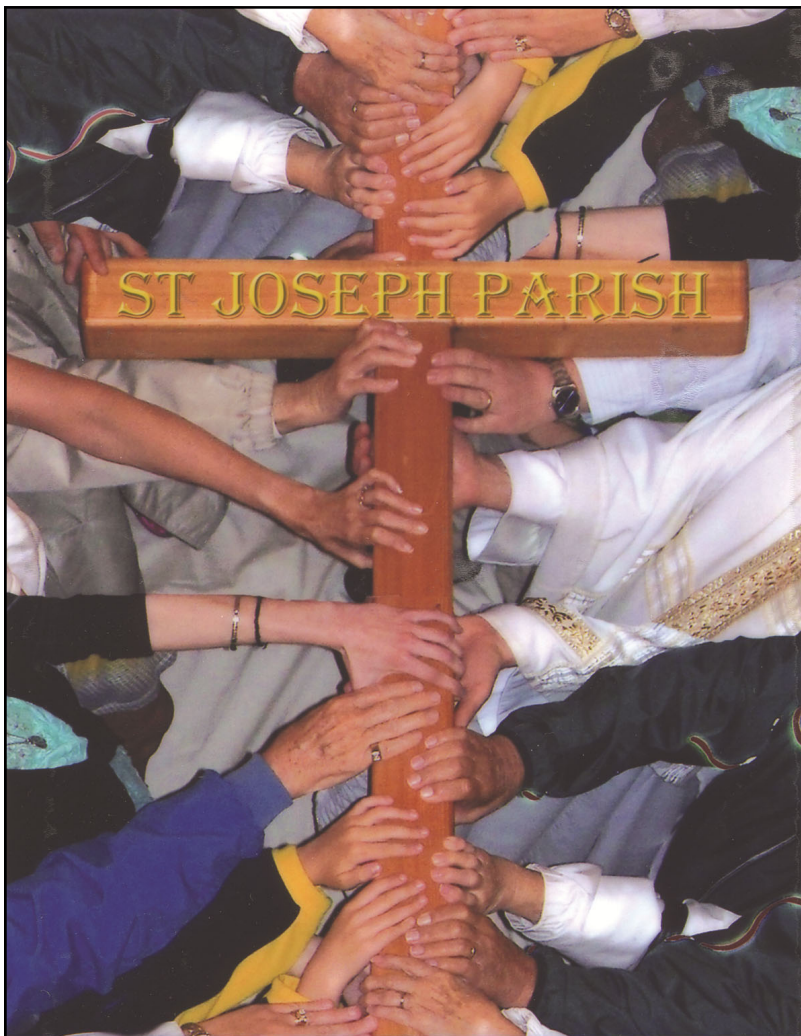

### Pastor's Column

Dear Parishioners:

Football season is upon us with kids thru adults putting teams together to compete with each other in the journey to the end zone. No matter what level of football, the goal is the same: get into the end zone with the football.

Concussions in football are becoming more of a concern because of the violence in the game. Many enjoy watching people get tackled/hit hard in the name of fierce competition. But a persistent limitation called "concussions" lingers on the football field. Jesus is constantly with us helping us in the Holy Spirit to discern our human limitations. Being hit hard in the head can lead to health problems later on. Jesus helps us juggle not only with head injuries but also with other behaviors that might be injurious to us.

Freely choosing to play football is risky but it is a legitimate choice we can make. Concussion consequences remind us of how fragile the human person is on and off the football field. Jesus is faithful to us in the Holy Spirit no matter what happens to us but the most important "end zone" is God's Kingdom of Love which includes taking loving care of the body God gives us.

### IT'S ALL ABOUT CONTROL

From toddlerhood to old age, we grow in mastery of our own lives, our bodies, and our destiny. This mastery is hard won, and we don't let go of autonomy easily. Much of this self-mastery involves the avoidance of pain or discomfort, so when we hear things like "take up your cross" and "lose your life," we tend to resist the message.

James says that faith without works is dead. Ouch! That is really a direct message! One way to look at this, as well as the part about losing our life to find it, is that faith is a process of more and more openness to God's direction of our lives. It is very hard for us to give up control, but perhaps what we are being asked to do is not to become passive and babyish, but to allow God to direct where our self-mastery will lead and what it will accomplish. We are asked to relinquish the need to control the results of our efforts; to risk, as Jesus did, the loss of everything we are working to achieve. We are asked to let God take the lead and to control the results, even though we may never see those results.

**TREASURES FROM  
OUR TRADITION**

Although New Year’s Day has been fixed firmly on January 1 for several hundred years, Labor Day has the feel of a great dividing line between leisure and routine. The pace of life has since picked up, and new schedules and commitments crowd in. In the background is God’s call to consider our schedules, the third commandment, still life-giving and binding, to make holy the Lord’s Day by worship and rest. Jews see the Sabbath, Saturday, not so much as a day of worship, but a day of rest, a day of renewing friendship with God by delighting in the beauty of creation and the joy of family and friends. It is a day for contemplating the wonders of God’s creation, but not disturbing it.

For Christians in the first three centuries, the Lord’s Day, Sunday, was not for rest, but worship. It was a regular work day. People met before dawn, and after Eucharist hurried off to daily routines. Today we come to Mass, but many hurry off to essential work, and not a day of rest. The Lord’s Day is not the Sabbath, but we can enhance Sunday’s ability to transform us if we consider embracing some Sabbath values: having a family meal, going for a walk in a beautiful place, making room in our lives to open ourselves more fully to holiness of life in Christ.

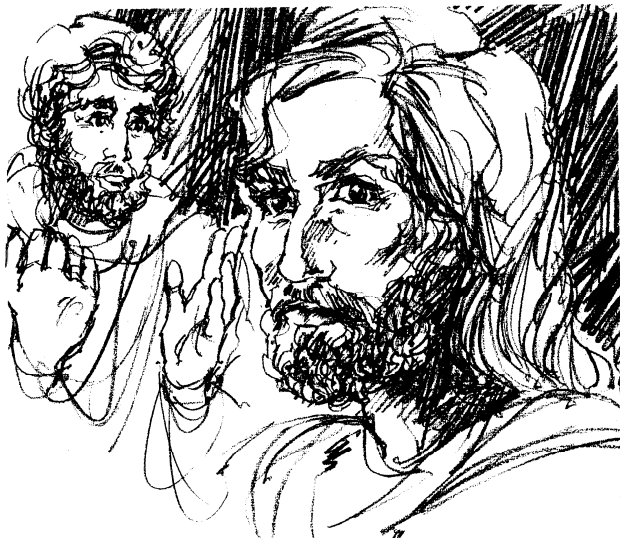
