

**Sunday Readings Reflections
of 12/6/2015****Reading 1 Baruch 5:1-9**

Perhaps you noticed right away that the author of this reading is a poet. He is filled with hope and joy as he assures the Israelites in exile that God will bring them back to the holy city of Jerusalem. They are suffering very much because they are far from their homeland. But their return will be such a joyful event that even the mountains, the valleys, and the forests will do what they can to make the journey easier! In this beautiful vision of the future, the people have God's "mercy and justice for company."

Advent is a time for making progress on our faith journey. Take time to give thanks for God's mercy and justice in your life.

Reading 2 Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11

In his letter to the Christians at Philippi, a city in Macedonia, Paul makes two things clear. The first is his great love and affection for the Philippians, who have helped him in his ministry. The second is his hope that they will continue to become more and more like Christ. Paul is looking forward to the second coming of Christ. And he wants to make sure that all Christ's followers will be ready to receive him when he comes. What will you do during this second week of Advent to show that you, too, are becoming more like Christ?

Gospel Luke 3:1-6

Why do you suppose Luke makes such an effort to pin down the historical timing of the preaching of John the Baptist? He gives us a complete rundown of Roman and Jewish leaders who were in power. Luke wants us to realize that John, a "common man" chosen by God, is much more important than any worldly ruler, because he is the herald who announces the Lord's coming. John urges the people to be baptized as a sign of their repentance for their sins. When they do this, they will make the path clear for Christ to come into their lives. Then all people "shall see the salvation of God."

Pastor's Column

Dear Parishioners:

We get confused about how to love God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength because we really don't understand what constitutes our whole heart, soul, mind and strength. Since we are limited in our humanness we can't comprehend this fullness of love approach except on the faith level. Yes, on the level of faith we become consumed with how God loves us with God's whole being which includes our human hearts, souls, minds and strengths and then also the mystery of the divine encompassing our entire humanity as revealed in Christ. We can't explain God's fullness of Love but through faith we can be in God's fullness of Love whose mystery impacts our whole heart, soul, mind and strength.

Faith reveals the all-pervasive presence of God's Love given to us in Holy Communion with Christ the Savior. It is gift from God; it is not earned. Once we are convinced via faith that God's full love permeates our very being as humans, then we find ourselves simply and easily loving our neighbors. Talk about a mystery! The possibilities of the different ways we can love our neighbors are endless in the eternal love of God within us in Christ. Some people we may declare are too difficult to love. However, in our Holy Communion with Christ Jesus, we will find ourselves being love to our most challenging neighbors. How can this be? To us who have faith in God's depth of love within us, let's observe how God transforms our hearts, souls, minds and strengths in the midst of our confusion about how to love God with our total person. Faith is the great unifier of love of God and neighbor. Let us bask in the gift of faith within us and rejoice every day in how God's Love is the constant possibility for us to love our neighbors.

Also persistent in his message is Paul as he encourages the Thessalonians--and all of us--to live in accordance with the kingship that Jeremiah foretold. He encourages us to conduct ourselves in ways of holiness so that we may be well prepared for the king's coming. Finally, Jesus himself tells us to be ever diligent so that we may gain favor before our God and King.

Jeremiah could see the kingship of Jesus coming. As we begin the season of Advent, Paul and Jesus tell us not only how to prepare for the Kingdom, but how to live it day to day.




